I have had the opportunity to meet several of you, our tenants, and I am looking forward to helping make Whiteman the best airport in the county. I have received a number of suggestions, which I am working to make happen. We have replaced almost all of the burned out or broken lights on the airport, filled potholes, put up banners announcing the Whiteman Airport Association Display Days and Young Eagle flights, and placed new signs along Airpark Way for the non-profit groups on the airport. We completed the annual inspections of over 700 hangars on the airport. In April we will start the inspections again. This time around, in addition to verifying the hangars are being utilized as agreed to when they were rented, we will service the doors and rollers. This should result in easier opening of the doors for you and us identifying any problems, like broken springs that need to be replaced. We will be publishing a tentative inspection schedule

next month.

Fire Extinguisher Inspection and Service, Monday March 25, 2020 — On Monday March 25 we will inspect and service all of the fire extinguishers in the County hangars. To accomplish this we need you to drop off your fire extinguishers at our office or with any of our Operations Coordinators before Monday, March 25. We will have them available to pick up starting Tuesday March 26. This is a big job, over 300 fire extinguishers!

They also use a program called Packet Tracer where they can create computer networks and simulate sending and receiving messages, as well as trouble shooting system designs.

Two working with instructors at Vista Aviation and two through Aviation Explorers Post Squadron 3. Reminders of Airport Rules

Please make sure you tie down your airplane in a designated parking spot when you are not flying. The speed limit for all vehicles is 10 MPH and 5 MPH in close proximity to airplanes. There is no overnight parking at the airport without a permit. To

get permission to leave a vehicle overnight, contact the Airport office. All vehicles operated or stored at the airport must be currently registered and insured. All of these rules are designed to keep the airport and tenants safe. During the high winds we had aircraft parts that were not properly

secured blowing around the airport. Fortunately, we did not have any damage to aircraft, other than the parts which blew off the aircraft.

LANCASTER, CA (February 7, 2020) – Officials for Los Angeles County Air Show “Aerospace Valley USA®”, presented by Lockheed Martin, are pleased to announce that the March 21st – 22nd, 2020 event will feature one of the most robust performer line-ups in the air show industry. Event organizers officially announced additions to the line-up including the US Navy F-35C Airshow Team from Naval Air Station Lemoore, CA, the U.S. Army Golden Knights Parachute Team, and aerobatic performer Chuck Coleman.

NAS Lemoore was the first West Coast naval installation to host the F-35C. Lemoore’s F-35Cs are assigned to the Rough Raiders Squadron (VFA) 125. The F-35C carrier variant (CV) is the world’s only 5th Generation, long-range stealth strike fighter designed and built explicitly for naval carrier operations. The F-35C combines this unique capability of operating from a carrier deck with the unmatched 5th Generation capabilities of stealth, fused sensors, and reliability; making the F-35C the Navy’s future first-day-of-the-war strike fighter.

As previously announced, headlining the air show will be the U.S. Navy Flight Demonstration Squadron, the Blue Angels. This is the Squadron’s first air show of their 2020 season following their El Centro practice demonstration flights. Previously announced performers include the USAF F-22 Raptor Demo Team, the Tora, Tora, Tora Warbird Show, Alabama Boys, Rob Harrison The Tumbling Bear and Vicky Benzing in her Stearman.

Returning to the 2020 Air Show will be the

popular Heroes and Legends history panel discussions. Preliminary panel topics include Women in Aviation, Celebration of the U-2 “Dragon Lady”, and War Eagle panel. Panelist will feature both veteran pilots and today’s inspirational leaders from the aviation industry.

As in the past, attendees will enjoy several impressive “on the ground” static displays.

New this year will be a display sharing the fascinating history of the Royal Air Force connection to the Antelope Valley “War Eagle Field”. This was a 640-acre flying school facility located in Lancaster, California which was opened in 1941 to provide flight training to British and Canadian cadets. The schools were operated by Major C.C. Mosely, president of Polaris Flight Academy. The Royal Air Force cadets were taught primary, basic and advanced flying. The schools also taught students from the Eagle Squadron, aviators from the United Kingdom, Canada, and other allied countries advanced combat flying skills. This unique history display is presented in partnership with the Antelope Valley Rural Museum, which will display photos and other historic memorabilia from the pilots who trained at War Eagle Field.

The Air Show will once again feature an interactive STEM Expo sponsored by Northrup Grumman, pilots and crew member meet and greets, exhibits, food, and more.
