A Reminder that Security is Everyone's Job

In a June 30th e-mail letter, Aircraft Owner's And Pilot's Association (AOPA) president, Phil Boyer, reminded certified flight instructors that airport and aircraft security are an important part of operating at GA airports. Boyer noted two recent events involving preventable thefts of small aircraft. Neither incident was terror related, nor resulted in loss of life. But, as Boyer pointed out in his message, both thefts raise concern that small aircraft could be vulnerable to terrorist activity. This is most unfortunate because it is relatively easy to secure GA aircraft - throttle locks, prop locks, tie-down locks, hangar storage - and GA airports – keeping your eyes open, reporting suspicious people or activity, not allowing piggy-backing through vehicle gates. All are simple, relatively inexpensive ways you can do your part to secure your aircraft and everyone's airport.

There have been no terrorist incidents involving GA aircraft, and security at GA airports is, at the moment, unregulated by the federal government. Last month's terrorist attacks on London's bus and subway system underscore that a terrorist chooses the path of least resistance. If general aviation is perceived to be vulnerable, it is vulnerable. Rest assured, AAC takes its own responsibility to provide a safe and secure airport very seriously. Report suspicious activity to airport staff or call the number below.

From the Manager:

Hangar Inspections

If your hangar was scheduled to be inspected in June or July, and was not, please contact the airport office before September 1st. We scheduled the June/July inspections on weekends so tenants would not have to take time from work. Inspections will now be done Monday through Friday, between 8:30 am and 4:45 pm. Inspections take about 5 minutes. We ask that you provide a spare key or a combination to your hangar lock. If you do, we can inspect your hangar, and you will not have to be present.

Support Your Airport Association

Please come out on the 3rd Thursday of each month to Rocky's Restaurant, and join the Whiteman Airport Association. For \$10 annual dues you can provide input on how to better run your airport.

Driving Safely on the Airport

Aircraft always have right of way, and vehicles are not allowed on the taxiway or taxilanes. You can reach both sides of the airport without impacting taxiing aircraft. When driving on the ramp between the main entry and the Heights (M&D, Hartmann Hangars, rows 31 and 32), stay on the northeast side of the broken double line. The posted speed limit is 10 MPH. Please drive safely.

Vehicle Gate Security

Only one vehicle per gate card or keypad activation may enter the airfield. If you approach the gate behind another vehicle, please do not piggy-back or tailgate through on the first vehicle's activation. Wait for the gate to close, then enter your own card or access the keypad to open the gate. Conversely, do not allow others to piggy-back on your gate activation, even if you know them. The only time it is appropriate to allow someone to follow you through the gate is when you are escorting your own guest's vehicle out to your aircraft. However, your guest must remain with you while on the ramp. To avoid confusion, we recommend you advise the airport before you plan to escort a guest vehicle through the gate.

New Construction

This is an exciting time for the Airport. Starting soon, construction on nine commercial aviation hangars and three commercial buildings will begin next to the twenty new hangars just southwest of hangar 31. This is in the area that tie-down rows 19 - 24 currently occupy, and where the old wash rack used to be. Eventually, construction will start on the dirt area enclosed by the new road and fence, and behind Rick Coulter's hangars. Once these two projects are complete, both Vista Aviation and Sun Quest will relocate from midfield to these new areas. When this happens, most of the vehicle traffic on the ramp should shift away from the taxiway and aircraft movement area.
