# Remembering YE Day, May 8, 1945

On May 8, 1945, General Dwight Eisenhower accepted surrender of Germany, ending World War II hostilities in Europe. For the first time since 1942, aircraft of the United States 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, and 15<sup>th</sup> Army Air Forces were not engaged against the enemy.

The Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress was a major component of the strategic bombing campaign against the Axis powers, flying from the United Kingdom, Africa, and Italy.

It is fitting, then, in honor of the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE Day, that Fox Airfield will play host to the B-17G *Sentimental Journey*. This historic war bird will be available for tours, viewing and rides May 3<sup>rd</sup> through May 9<sup>th</sup>. Saturday and Sunday, May 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>, will feature special observances of VE Day organized by veterans' organizations.

Sentimental Journey is operated by the Arizona Wing of the Commemorative Air Force. She last visited the Antelope Valley in 2003, with great outpouring of interest and popularity.

The aircraft will over fly the Valley on May 3<sup>rd</sup>, from Palmdale to Mojave, paying special attention to schools. The arrival is planned to coincide with the lunch hour to maximize the opportunity to see this beautifully restored aircraft in flight.

This special event is an all-volunteer venture sponsored by Antelope Valley companies, businesses, organizations, and individuals. A Civil Air Patrol color guard and WW II veterans will greet the aircraft upon arrival at Fox Airfield. Students from Lancaster High School will display historical projects in the airport lobby. WWII-era aircraft models will be suspended from the airport lobby ceiling, courtesy of local clubs. The Antelope Valley Aviation Museum will display models of Allied and Axis aircraft.

## Fire Extinguisher Servicing

One last reminder to all tenants in LA County hangars, we will service your fire extinguisher on May 16<sup>th</sup>. Please have your extinguisher to our office no later than 4:00 p.m. on **May 15<sup>th</sup>**.

#### Parked Vehicles

Vehicles may not be parked on the airport for extended periods of time without prior approval. Vehicles parked long-term without approval are subject to tow. Contact the airport office for more information.

#### Trash Receptacles

We are once again seeing some unauthorized dumping of household items on the airport. Furniture, appliances and other household items may not be disposed of in the airport's trash receptacles. Aside from overflowing the dumpsters, causing FOD and creating an eyesore, they often require a special and costly service call to be removed. Please advise the airport office if you observe misuse of the dumpsters.
